**ETYMOLOGY** (seu-der-ANTH-e-mum) Gk pseudos = false + genus Eranthemum also in Acanthaceae to

which there was some resemblance; The species variabile referring to colour;

LIFEFORM 30cm Herb

ORIGIN Gurulmundi Q, Bega NSW, Vic, Groote Eylandt NT, SA

HABITAT Wet sclerophyll AMVf, LMVf, SEVT

**LEAVES** Opposite, 1-5 cm, dark green hairy above purplish and dotted with glands below narrow,

lanceolate to oval; tip blunt to sharp base rounded or wedge-shaped edges wavy on 5-30 mm

petiole;

**FLOWERS** Tubular, 10-15 mm elongate, white to mauve, sometimes with darker spots on lower lobe;

terminal lobes 5-8 mm, lower ones small and often cleistogamous; pedicels 1-8 mm; bracteoles 2-4 mm. Calyx 4-8 mm. **Flowering:** Nov, Dec, Jan, Feb, March, April, May

FRUIT Capsules, 1-1.5 cm, narrow, pubescent, glabrous, brown, hairy containing 1-4 seed 3 mm

dehiscence explosive; Fruiting Times: Sept, Oct, Nov

**BARK** creeping rhizome, roots tuberous

**STEM** Perennial herb, 15-30cm, branches hairy; Erect rounded sometimes branching;

**ETHNOBOTANY** Good rockery plant, attracts butterflies

**PESTS** Blue banded Bee & Cutting Bee

**BUTTERFLY** Doleschallia bisaltide australis (leafwing), Junonia orithya albincta (blue argus), Hypolimnas

alimena lamina (blue-banded eggfly), Hypolimnas misippus (danaid eggfly), Hypolimnas bolina

nerina (common eggfly)

**COMMENTS** World has 60 species; Australia has 3 species;
