QLD DISTRICTS Burnett, Moreton, Port Curtis, South Kennedy, Wide Bay

HABITAT Subtropical/Dry/Lowland Rainforest, Araucaria Notophyll/Microphyll Vineforest

LEAVES Opposite, 7-16 x 4 cm, arranged in whorls, dark glossy green, paler with scattered white

hairs, variable in shape often narrow on juvenile shoots the lateral veins oblique & strongly

raised above Stipules united into sheath;

FLOWERS White, 2cm, (scented) staminal filaments fused to white corolla, borne single in leaf axils

Flowering Times Aug, Sept, Oct, Nov

FRUIT Berries, 1.5-2 cm, egg-shaped, bright red with several seeds; Fruiting Times April, May,

June, July

ETHNOBOTANY Fruits contain a sweet edible pulp;

TOLERANCE Needs shaded position and well-drained soil;

INSECTS Cephonodes spp. Bee Hawk Moth

BIRD Fruit eaten by birds
